

## About KSBA



The Association, founded in 1936, serves school board members and school districts in areas such as governmental relations, board member and team development, legal services, policy services, publications and community relations.

The Association is governed by a 27-member board of directors made up of representatives elected as regional chairpersons or as directors-at-large. With nearly 900 school board members, KSBA is the largest organization of elected officials in Kentucky.
