Finance II: Dollars and Sense

Participants will learn about the budgetary process and how to provide guidance and oversight of a fiscally responsible budget that supports the mission of the district. Learn about the different funding sources including restricted and discretionary funds, how to ask the right questions and identify budget "leaks". (Includes budgetary decisions, requirements, reporting and timelines.)

Finance III: Dollars and Decisions

This session extends the budgeting and resource allocation down to the "desktop". Participants will learn how policy and discretionary decisions impact instructional quality at the school level including classroom sizes and instructional material. The session will cover the decision making process from student data desegregation, identifying cognitive and non-cognitive needs and prioritizing allocation of funds. (Includes school resource allocations, data driven decision making, staffing formulas, the role of the site based council and comprehensive school improvement plans.)

Setting Tax Rates Made Easy

Every school board is required to set an annual tax rate - but not every board member enjoys doing it. Learn the nuts and bolts needed to tackle this challenge with confidence.

The Board and the New Superintendent Evaluation Process

During the 2014-2015 school year, school board members were asked to become familiar with the new superintendent evaluation system (SPGES-Superintendent Professional Growth and Effectiveness System) developed by a statewide committee working with the education department. This session explains the process for effective evaluation that uses a continuous improvement model, as well as the standards in the Superintendent Leadership Plan that is part of the new system. Discussions will focus on the evaluation instrument, performance levels and examples of evidence of performance.

Social Media, School Leaders and Ethics

School and district leaders have a greater ability to connect with students, parents, staff and other stakeholders, thanks to the growing use of social media such as Facebook and Twitter. But social media outlets carry their own sets of challenges, especially on the ethical management of district and personal use. This course introduces participants to the basics of social media, ethical problems and opportunities for leaders and their districts.

Courses are \$40 each however there is no fee to participate in the superintendent evaluation training thanks to a partnership with the Prichard Committee and funding through the Gates Foundation. All sessions earn board member training credit or EILA credit.
